HOSTED FIRST INTERNATIONAL VIRTUAL CONFERENCE **DIVERSITY, INCLUSION AND EQUITY:**

SYNERGIES AND CHALLENGES IN THE WAKE OF COVID - 19

The two-day multidisciplinary international virtual conference which highlighted the challenges in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, suggesting more holistic and cost-efficient strategies in each sector without discrimination, was held on the 13th and 14th November 2020.

The Virtual Conference titled 'Diversity, Inclusion and Equity: Synergies and Challenges in the Wake of COVID-19' was organised by the Faculty of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences of Ziauddin University (ZU) and the National Academy of Higher Education (NAHE), Islamabad.

Prof Shaheen Sardar Ali, rector at NAHE, in her keynote address analysed the challenges as well as the opportunities of the pandemic and its unintended consequences.

On the positive side, she said the transformation to online delivery of academic programmes led to adaptation of new skills and competencies.

The work-from-home strategy, however, created additional burden on women with responsibilities as they would now look after young children, attend to their daily needs, facilitate children's online learning and, at the same time, perform household chores.

"Women employees globally worked under these unforeseen pressures and constraints, with little or no support from employers," she said. Talking about the barriers to online learning, Dr. Shaheen Sardar said the HEC had received complaints from students in remote areas that they didn't have the internet access to continue their online education.

Dr. Nida Hussain, ZU pro chancellor, spoke about the university's commitment to authentic multidisciplinary research and said the university took pride in offering its forum for debates and intellectual discussions in all disciplines.

Dr. Caroline Manion, Senior Lecturer at University of Toronto, Canada, said the pandemic had created the largest and longest global disruption of school-based education in modern history.



The conference was broadcasted live on the ZU's Facebook page.

Idara-e-Taleem-o-Aagahi (ITA) Chief Executive Officer Baela Raza Jamil said the COVID-19 pandemic has been an unprecedented global emergency, affecting every single field of life including education services. "The pandemic has pushed state and non-state educators to redesign learning actions and platforms through blended approaches of face-to-face and distance digital solutions, more holistic, accelerated, cost-effective and human above all," she remarked.

Prof Dr. Frances Schoonmaker, Professor



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
Emerita Teachers College, Columbia University, United States, spoke about 'rethinking access and equity in education'. She said educators would not be able to erase the self-perpetuating effects of inequity, lack of access to education services and racial injustice until they found ways of addressing the cultural myths embedded in our various personal and national histories.

She advised the conference participants to examine their own histories and trace the emergence of discriminatory practices towards women and minorities that were passed on to teachers.



In his welcome address, ZU Vice Chancellor Prof Dr. Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui said all the participants had come together to address the challenges posed by COVID-19 and built synergies during these trying times to make the world a better place to live in.

Discussing the conference highlights, Conference Chair Prof Dr. Fauzia Shamim said COVID-19 brought for everyone the urgent need for access to digital resources and literacy. She added that in the process, it had brought to the fore the issues of access and equity in the education and health sectors.



DEATH ANNIVERSARY OF SIR DR. ZIAUDDIN AHMAD

The 73rd death anniversary of Sir Dr. Ziauddin Ahmad was marked on 23 December 2020. His devotion and tireless involvement in changing the mindset of Muslims of the subcontinent is commendable.

He was the first one from the subcontinent to earn the Sir Isaac Newton award. Practically speaking, he was a savior of the Muslim middle class. He fought alongside Quaid-i-Azam, and won his assembly seat in undivided India.

After the independence, the Quaid selected him for a foreign educational trip as the head of a commission to study the modern trends in education. He died before he could return to the country.

Sir Dr. Ziauddin wanted to promote modern education. Had the education system designed by him been adopted, Pakistan would have definitely benefitted in the long run.

A LOOK INTO THE HUMAN RIGHTS HISTORY OF PAKISTAN AND ITS FUTURE OUTLOOK WITH EXPERTS

Ziauddin University held the 4th interactive series of "ZU Dialogues" titled, "Human Rights Vision 2020 & Beyond" in collaboration with the Ziauddin Faculty of Law to mark Human Rights Day on December 16, 2020.

The aim behind this online dialogue session was to enhance the knowledge and understanding of human rights, and foster attitudes of tolerance, respect, solidarity, and responsibility. Most importantly, the webinar's purpose was to encourage everyone to develop a voice to protect those suffering from human rights violations.

The event was hosted by Syed Muaz Shah, Director of the Centre for Human Rights, Ziauddin Faculty of Law. He served as an inspiration since the topics discussed focused on highlighting the journey of human rights in Pakistan. Muaz Shah began the webinar by asking all students and young people watching to "be the change you want to see".

Giving his final remarks about the discussion, Vice Chancellor of Ziauddin University Prof Dr. Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui stated that human rights is a very important topic of discussion. "Our forefathers have sacrificed their precious lives for this country and I feel saddened to say that even after getting independence, we are still struggling and fighting to get human rights and raise our voice. ZIAUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOLDS A VIRTUAL SEMINAR "EARLY DETECTION, SAVES LIVES!"

TO MARK BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

"Breast cancer is one of the leading causes of death and the most common cancer among women all over the world including Pakistan. To control breast cancer, we need to stop it from an early stage. We have 90 to 95 percent chances to recover from it

successfully only if it is detected in the early stages, said Dr. Nida Hussain, Pro Chancellor of Ziauddin University.

She shared her views in a virtual seminar "Early Detection, Saves Lives!" organised by the PR & Communications department of Ziauddin University, to mark the Breast Cancer Awareness Month on Wednesday, October 21, 2020. The event was broadcasted live on

Ziauddin University's facebook page.

Dr. Nida Hussain suggested that young women of age 20-30 years must make breast screening and self-examination a habit. She emphasised that women must not delay it if they feel an unusual change in their body. Massive awareness sessions are required at this point in time

While talking about the challenges that

oncologists had faced during COVID-19, Prof. Tariq Siddiqui, Consultant Oncologist and Director Cancer Centre, Dr. Ziauddin Hospital said, "We need to fight breast cancer throughout the year and should not wait for the month of October only to create awareness. Our society

and especially females need awareness because screening and awareness is the main key to control this cancer".

Dr. Nida Wahid Bashir, Consultant Breast & General Surgeon, Dr. Ziauddin Hospital while answering the question about how fast breast cancer can spread, she said that cancer in young females, pregnant females and in between the tenure of breast feeding is always aggressive and has the ability to spread faster. Breast

cancer in pregnant women is the worst kind of cancer we have come across. Whenever women feel changes in their breasts, without any delay they need to get it checked by a doctor.

"Usually, common cases of breast

cancer we receive are about 50-60 percent of the old or middle-aged group but now we have cases of young girls," said Dr. Zubia Masood, Consultant Breast & General Surgeon, Dr. Ziauddin Hospital. She was talking about risk factors in breast cancer.

She said that there are two types of risk factors in breast cancer: genetic and environmental factors.

Genetic factors cannot be

changed but environmental factors can be changed. Body weight, physical activity, alcohol use, smoking, exposure to hormones, pregnancy and discontinuation of breastfeeding, high fat diets, late marriages, and radiation exposure are modifiable risk factors. Whereas, non-modifiable risk factors include gender and age, family cancer history and genetics, early menstruations and late menopause, breast density and breast sizes
